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HOUSE BILL 26-1050

OPTIONAL INDIVIDUALIZED READINESS PLAN FOR SCHOOL [CODIFIED AT COLO. REV. STAT. §22-7-1014; §22-7-1019; §22-7-1205]

This statute allows preschools to forgo individualized readiness plans when the student, through assessments, demonstrates proficiency on the kindergarten reading assessment and each domain of cognitive, physical well-being and motor development, social and emotional development, language and comprehension development, literacy, and math. A school is required to provide an individualized readiness plan when a parent or legal guardian requests such a plan.

The school readiness assessment includes a written notice to parents or legal guardians of the students that must contain the results of the student's assessment and if the student's results are such that an individualized readiness plan is not required, the school needs to explain to the parents or guardians that the school is not required to and does not intend to provide the student with an individualized readiness plan, but the parent or legal guardian may still request the school provide such a plan.
