Statewide Measures

Proposition HH

Reduce Property Taxes and Retain State Revenue

- Proposition HH would reduce the assessment rate for both primary residences and commercial and agricultural properties. *The assessment rate determines how much of a property's value is subject to taxation.*
 - This system would be in place for the next 10 years if Proposition HH were to pass.
 - Colorado schools are funded with a mix of local property taxes and state money.
- ★ Education funding measure- not just a property tax measure



Statewide Measures

Proposition II (pronounced “eye-eye”)

Retain Nicotine Tax Revenue in Excess of Blue Book Estimate

- Allows the state to keep \$23.7 million raised through a nicotine tax Colorado voters approved in 2020.
- Because the tax raised more money than originally predicted, the state is required by the Taxpayers Bill of Rights (TABOR) to ask voters if it can keep the extra revenue generated.
- If voters say yes, the state will get to keep any excess revenue in future years as well.

Adams 12

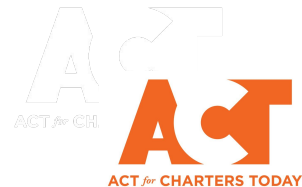

Voting Deadlines

**October
16th**

Ballots start to get mailed to all Colorado voters

**October
30th**

Last day to mail in your ballot (postmark date)

**November
7th**

Election Day/Vote in-person or drop off your ballot at a dropbox by 7pm
