GETTING TO THE CAPITOL

The entire event will take place at the Capitol Building | 200 E Colfax Avenue, Denver, CO 80203

Buses:

- All tour buses visiting the Capitol must load and unload all passengers on the corner of Grant and Colfax. Grant is one way southbound.
- The bus driver must remain on and move the bus after unloading passengers.
- No tour bus parking is allowed on Grant - loading and unloading ONLY.
- Tour buses may park on Broadway, between the hours of 9:30-2:30

Cars:

Parking is not available onsite at the Capitol. Metered parking and pay lots are located nearby.

- We will validate parking at The Denver Post Lot located at 101 W Colfax Ave
 - To enter the garage via the Broadway entrance: Head South on N. Broadway. Garage entrance is on the right of the Building.
 - To enter garage via Cleveland entrance:
 - Option 1: Head South on N. Broadway. Turn right onto Cleveland Place. The destination is on the left before 15th Street.
 - Option 2: Head South on N. Broadway. Turn right onto Cheyenne Place. Turn right onto W Colfax Ave. Turn right onto Cleveland Place. Destination is on the right.
 - Option 3: Head North on 14th St. Turn left onto Court Place. Continue until N Broadway, then turn right onto N Broadway. Turn right onto Cleveland Place. Destination is on the left.

To have your parking validated, bring your ticket to the capitol and ask for a validation sticker from League staff.

Entering the Capitol:

Two entrances are available for Capitol visitors.

- You may enter the building on the north side (Colfax and Sherman Avenues), up the stairs,
- You may use the ADA accessible ground level entrance (14th and Sherman Avenues), under the stairs.



Security

All visitors to the State Capitol should be prepared to go through a standard security screening upon entry, similar to airport-style security. This includes walking through a metal detector and having bags scanned, so plan a few extra minutes for this process.

To help things move smoothly, avoid bringing prohibited items and keep personal belongings minimal and easy to access. Common prohibited items at state capitol buildings typically include weapons of any kind (such as firearms, knives, pepper spray, or multi-tools), as well as items that could be used as weapons.

DRESS CODE:

When visiting the State Capitol, students should dress in a way that feels authentic to who they are while also being appropriate for a professional, public setting. Comfortable shoes are strongly recommended, as there will likely be a lot of walking and standing throughout the day. School spirit wear or swag is encouraged and welcomed as a great way to proudly represent your school.
