

THINGS TO DO AT THE CAPITOL

You may have some downtime at the Capitol on Advocacy Day between meetings with policymakers. There is lots to see while you're here, so check out some of the things you can do with your group with your extra time.

● Take a Capitol tour

Free guided tours of the Capitol are available at 10:00am, 11:00am, 12:00pm, and 1:00pm. The tours begin at the Visitor Information Desk on the 1st floor and are limited to 30 people on a first-come, first-served basis, so get there early to get a spot. Capitol tours take about an hour and include a trip to the dome observation area.

● Watch floor proceedings from the galleries

The House of Representatives and the Senate both meet to discuss and debate bills in their chambers in the Capitol. Each of these chambers has an upper area where you can watch and listen to the action happening on the floor. You can access the galleries on the 2nd floor.

● Take a break and grab a snack

The basement of the Capitol has a cafe area with tables and booths where you can regroup and purchase snacks and drinks. The main public restrooms are also located in the basement if your group needs them.

● Write "Thank you" notes

Colorado League of Charter Schools staff will have "Thank you" notes available during our morning sessions. Fill one out for the legislators you visit - be sure to have all your students sign and include your contact information so your policymaker can reach you with any follow-up questions. Once your thank you notes are ready, give them back to a League staff, and we'll get them delivered for you.
